As a result, he found it didn't take him long to get over his aversion to country music. In fact, he staved with "Hoedown" for three years and made a number of country recordings, one of which called "Remember Me" made No. 3 on the Toronto hit charts.

Later, while on a trip to get married in Sweden, he stopped off in London and got himself a series on BBC-TV of eight one-hour country shows as host and lead singer.

"When I came back, I decided I'd try and crack folk music-country- oriented folk music," he said. He sang in many of the clubs around town. But it wasn't until he bought himself out of his contract with Chateau Records, a small Canadian company, and joined the U.S. firm of folk impres-
